

The higher demand for peer supervision, attestation and eye examinations requirements will increase the fees which are already too high.

Also, the council has a history of being biased against the members in favour of illegitimate patient complaints, (in some cases), and not supportive.

This encourages a litigant behavior on the part of the complainant.

Many dentists also resent the "Big Brother" approach and a relatively hostile approach to APC holders.

So I recommend a tailoring back of the over -supervisory proposals.
