Voluntary Bonding Scheme 2023 Intake – Oral Health Therapists

The Voluntary Bonding Scheme (the Scheme) is a practical initiative run by Te Whatu Ora to encourage recently qualified health professionals to work in the communities and specialties that need them most, and to retain essential health professionals throughout Aotearoa New Zealand. Those on the scheme can receive payments to help repay their student loan (or as top-up income for those without a loan).

If you are an oral health therapist:

- whose final year of undergraduate study was 2020, 2021 or 2022, **and**
- you intend to work for eligible hard-to-staff providers/practices for at least three and up to five years, you may be eligible to register for the 2023 Intake of the Scheme.

If your registration is accepted and you meet the terms and conditions, a **bond payment of \$11,796 (after tax) is available** after the completion of a minimum of three years' service, and up to two **additional payments of \$3,932** after a fourth year and fifth year.

The six-week Registration of Interest period for the Scheme's 2023 Intake **is anticipated to open in mid-February 2023**. Registration will be via an online web-form available on [the Te Whatu Ora website](#).

 - Te Manu Toroa - Tauranga
 - Tipu Ora - Rotorua
 - Ngati Porou Hauora - Te Puia Springs / Ruatoria
 - Te Taiwhenua o Heretaunga – Heretaunga / Hastings
 - Ora Toa PHO - Porirua

- Māori Oral Health Providers (to be assessed on a case-by-case basis) *
 - Pacific Oral Health Providers (to be assessed on a case-by-case basis) *
 - practices located in rural or remote areas (to be assessed on a case-by-case basis) *
